complaint, the prisoner claimed that they were denied medical attention for a possible heart attack or blood clot. Kyle urged the Board to look into the conditions at the jail.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on April 1, 2020 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were County Board Chairman John Shure, Lyle Behrends, Charlie Alt, Roger Bard, Barbara Offill and Joe Young. Michael McTaggart was absent. Also present Finance Manager Jill Johnson, County Clerk Breein Suver, County Engineer Joel Moore and Myron Munyon with Compass Insurance.

The meeting was called to order.

It was moved by Barbara Offill and seconded by Joe Young to approve the agenda. Motion carried by a voice vote.

There were no public comments.

The Committee Chairs gave their monthly reports:

- Management and Judicial Chairman Lyle Behrends reported the Judicial Committee will hear their standard reports. The Management Committee will also hear their standard reports and continue discussions on the solar farm and the County Farm drainage tile.
- Tax/Planning & Zoning Chairman Roger Bard reported the committee will hear their standard reports. The agenda will also include zoning opportunities for rural homesteads.
- Health Chairman Barbara Offill reported the Health Committee will hear their regular reports from the health department.
- I.T. Chairman Joe Young reported the I.T. Committee will hear their standard reports from AreaWide.
- County Engineer Joel Moore reported the Highway meeting will be held at the Highway Department. The committee will open bids for paving for Chebanse, a bridge for Stockland and striping for the County.

During Chairman comments, County Board Chairman John Shure brought it to the attention of the committee of the activity in Springfield. There are many bills trying to be passed through legislature that have to do with counties and municipalities. Shure said all of them seem to be restrictive and the board members need to be made aware. One bill in particular is to abolish the office of Coroner. If the bill passes, the County would need to find a local licensed physician and appoint them as a medical examiner.

The committee continued discussions regarding County Board redistricting and setting salaries for the County Board to be completed by July 1st. Information was distributed comparing the current 20 member board to a reduced 16 member board. Also, the I.T. committee would be consolidated with the Finance committee and the Judicial committee would be reduced to 5 members. The current per diem is \$35. This amount could be increased to \$47 or rounded up to \$50. There will also be a savings in mileage reimbursement. The statute says to use the most recent census numbers available for redistricting, which would be from 2010.

Finance Manager Jill Johnson gave an update on the sexual harassment training. We are at a 58% completion rate so far. Another in person training can be scheduled, if needed.

Shure discussed SB1602 and HB804. SB1602 includes standards for wind farms and if the bill passes, the County is required to amend their ordinance immediately. The County currently has a moratorium in place on the solar ordinance. There is a corresponding bill, HB804, which serves the same purpose. Shure would like to oppose both bills. It was moved by Behrends and seconded by Offill to pass an ordinance opposing SB1602 and a similar ordinance opposing HB804 to be sent to our representatives in the House and Senate leadership of both parties. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Correspondence was reviewed with the committee.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Young and seconded by Bard to approve the claims subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried

During old business, Myron Munyon with Compass Insurance reminded the committee of trainings that are available.

There was no new business.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Offill and seconded by Bard to adjourn at 9:54 A.M. Motion carried by a voice vote.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on April 5, 2021 at 9:06 A.M. Members present Lyle Behrends, Charlie Alt, Paul Bowers, Sherry Johnson and John Zumwalt. Kevin Bohlmann and Paul Ducat were absent. Also present County Board Chairman John Shure, Finance Manager Jill Johnson and Maintenance Supervisor Chris Drake.

The meeting was called to order.

Maintenance Supervisor Chris Drake's report included the following:

- Inspections for the elevators and fire extinguishers were completed.
- Drake spent time picking up around the properties to prepare for mowing season.
- Maintenance was done on the County truck.
- The cell door project is expected to begin at the end of April/beginning of May. The project should be done within two weeks.
- Drake was contacted by a Kiwanis member and they have offered to do some volunteer gardening work in front of the Courthouse.
- The excess rain this month caused unexpected leakage in parts of the buildings.
- A new part-time housekeeper has been hired for the Administrative Center.
- Restrooms have been painted, rugs were power washed and new toilet seats were installed at the Administrative Center.
- The employee breakroom project is still in the works. Further discussion will need to be held regarding the restrooms and countertops in that area.
- In December, the committee received a verification report from SmartWatt that detailed the County's savings. An email from the County is needed to approve the report. SmartWatt is also available to attend a meeting to review the report with the committee. The report shows we have surpassed the guaranteed savings by \$6,000. County Board Chairman John Shure requested further review of the report and possibly another report be created to monitor our savings before approval.

The committee discussed the drainage tile on the County Farm. John Zumwalt spoke with Stephanie Spiros of Walker Farms and they both agreed that it is Walker Farms responsibility to repair the broken tile. As of yesterday, the tile has not been repaired. Zumwalt also received approval from the landowner to the west of the County Farm in regards to replacing the tile. Shure noted the committee may want to consult with State's Attorney Jim Devine before entering into an agreement with a private landowner.

Bids for the County Farm lease are planned for the July agenda.

Discussion on Clean Energy Design Group is tabled pending approval from State's Attorney Jim Devine.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Bowers and seconded by Zumwalt to pay the claims, subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on April 6, 2021 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Barbara Offill, Roger Bard, Ernie Curtis, Thomas Lynch and John Zumwalt. Kevin Coughenour and Leanne Duby were absent. Also present County Board Chairman John Shure, Finance Manager Jill Johnson, ICPHD Administrator Dee Schippert and EMA Director Eric Ceci.

The meeting was called to order.

It was moved by Roger Bard and seconded by Ernie Curtis to approve the agenda. Motion carried by a voice vote.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by John Zumwalt and seconded by Curtis to pay the claims, subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

There were no public comments.

ICPHD Administrator Dee Schippert distributed the monthly summary report of programs.

Schippert gave an update on COVID-19 stating the number of cases continue to trend downwards. To date, there have been 17 first dose clinics and 12 second dose clinics with a total of 9,741 vaccinations given by ICPHD. It was also explained that the clinics have been held at Iroquois Memorial Hospital at no cost and appointments are available. Clinics are being held by using part of the ICPHD staff and part of the hospital staff. It was also explained funds were received by a mass vaccination grant totaling \$150,000. ICPHD is planning for \$50,000 to cover the salaries of employees that worked at the clinics and giving \$100,000 to Iroquois Memorial Hospital for the use of their facility, services and supplies.

Schippert explained that the Johnson & Johnson vaccine will begin to be given in house at ICPHD starting this week. The Johnson & Johnson vaccine is one dose versus Moderna and Pfizer which are two dose vaccines. Individuals must be eighteen or older to receive the Johnson & Johnson or Moderna vaccines and sixteen or older for Pfizer. ICPHD is opening vaccination clinics up to the entire state of Illinois as appointments are still available. Schippert stated that the COVID-19 vaccination is not a live vaccine and people will not contract the virus after receiving it. After the vaccination, some may experience symptoms that are normal and relate to the body's immune response. EMA Director Eric Ceci suggested the public view the ingredient listings for the vaccines or call the health department with their questions for accurate information.

Ceci went on to review data sheets displaying the numbers COVID-19 confirmed cases and probable cases in Iroquois County. Schippert clarified that ICPHD defines a confirmed positive case by a PCR molecular test where as a probable positive case is by a rapid test. She also verified that a person being isolated is the direct positive case and the quarantined persons are the positive cases close contacts.

There was no old business.

There was no new business.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Zumwalt and seconded by Roger Bard to adjourn at 9:32 A.M. Motion carried by a voice vote.

Whereas, safe and healthy childhoods produce confident and successful adults; and


Whereas, child abuse and neglect often occurs when people find themselves in stressful situations without community resources, and don't know how to cope; and

Whereas, child abuse and neglect can be reduced by making sure each family has the support they need in raising their children in a safe, nurturing environment; and

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on April 8, 2021 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Charlie Alt, Paul Bowers, Ernie Curtis, Steve Huse and Joe Young. Also present County Board Chairman John Shure, Finance Manager Jill Johnson, Sheriff Derek Hagen, County Clerk Breein Suver, 911 Director Eric Raymond, Treasurer Kurt Albers and Suzie Werner with HomeStar Insurance.

The meeting was called to order.

It was moved by Joe Young and seconded by Paul Bowers to approve the agenda. Motion carried by a voice vote.

There were no public comments.

Suzie Werner with HomeStar Insurance reported there was a glitch with the claim feed from Health Alliance to Benefit Planning Consultants for the health reimbursements. Only a few employees were effected and all matters have been resolved. Werner has also begun working with Health Alliance on the early renewal for July.

The department heads gave their monthly reports. They are as follows:

- Finance Manager Jill Johnson reported the audit process is still ongoing. CliftonLarsonAllen continues to test for the single audit.
- County Clerk Breein Suver reported the consolidated election was Tuesday, April 6th and voter turnout was between 26-27%. A new hire started in the office on April 5th.
- Treasurer Kurt Albers reported on the closing of the BB&T account. Originally we were told the funds couldn't be transferred because the project was closed and it was past the 90-180 days. After speaking with another bank representative, they

have requested copies of claims the County has paid and a reimbursement will be made to the County.

- Sheriff Derek Hagen submitted a claim to the committee for payment for picking up a prisoner in Mason City, IA. Two correctional officers have both successfully completed the academy and passed their tests. Hagen said he has one more correctional officer to send to the academy. Within the next 30-60 days, the cell door project will begin.
- County Board Chairman John Shure spoke about the legislation in Springfield and asked that the board members do their research and contact the State Representative and State Senator to make their views known. The Policy & Procedure committee approved a resolution against SB2602 and HB804 which primarily deals with wind farms but it also takes away local zoning control from the County. Another bill making its way through the legislative process now is to take away the office of Coroner.
- 911 Director Eric Raymond reported a new hire started on Tuesday. ETSB approved a Capital Improvement Plan for the next few years. There are a few items that impact the County such as the server area, public safety software and a new phone system. Items projected for 2021 include a generator, tower maintenance, fire suppression and cage for server area and repeaters.

In prior months, the committee has discussed receiving bids for health and liability insurance. It was moved by Bowers and seconded by Steve Huse to send out bids for the health and liability insurance. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Young and seconded by Huse to pay the claims subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

During new business, Suver informed the committee the Assessment Office will be rolling to her office today and the extension process will begin. Tax bills are on track to be sent out the same time as last year.

The SAN server is one piece of the server network and is the storage for all of the data. The warranty was previously extended on the SAN server but Taber explained manufacturers typically do not extend warranties past 7 years. The committee discussed budgeting options for these items over the next 5 years.

Taber discussed security for the guest Wi-Fi at the Administrative Center. He stated the Wi-Fi is password protected but the password hasn't been changed in quite some time. Also, a disclaimer was attached in the past but it was turned off while troubleshooting an issue and hasn't been turned back on. It is mostly used for outside vendors while conducting County business and the password is not publicized.

Finance Manager Jill Johnson reviewed the new website with the committee. A few changes are still in the works. Johnson said there have been a few glitches with the amount of time it is taking to post to the website but everything seems to be working itself out with the help of Webfoot Designs. Taber suggested adding a message stating "you are leaving the Iroquois

County website” when clicking on an external link. Johnson also explained the ADA compliant features such as the font size. Shure made a request to place the meetings and agendas on the front page, as he believes they would be easily accessible to the public. Also, a link to IKAN needs to be added to the website. County Clerk Breein Suver voiced her concern about the time it was taking to refresh and post items on the website.

Shure brought it to Taber’s attention that emails being sent from him to Executive Assistant Amanda Longfellow are not being received. He is not having this issue with any other emails. The matter is being corrected with AreaWide.
