Illinois National Guard Assists with Iroquois County Vaccinations

WATSEKA, IL – The Iroquois County Public Health Department (ICPHD), in partnership with the Illinois National Guard, will be conducting a community-based, Moderna (2 dose) COVID-19 vaccination clinic for Illinois residents, aged 18 and older at the Iroquois County Fairgrounds **today, Monday, April 19, 2021** from 9 AM to 6 PM. The second dose will be administered on May 17, 2021 at the same location. **Walk-ins are welcome.** There is no cost for the COVID-19 vaccine.

The vaccination clinic will be held at the Iroquois County Fairgrounds 4H Building located 1390 E 2000 North Road, Watseka, IL 609670. Individuals are required to bring a valid form of photo ID. If you do not feel well the day of your appointment or are in isolation or quarantine, please call ICPHD to reschedule. Patients will need to wear a face covering, practice social distancing, and plan to allow at least 15 minutes for observation after the vaccination. Please wear clothing to allow easy access to the upper portion of the arm for the injection.

As more vaccine is allocated ICPHD will communicate availability, along with when, where, and how to receive the vaccine, via traditional and social media outlets as well as on the ICPHD website:
