The phased opening and executive order were issued in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, they require social distancing measures to be taken to stop the spread of the highly contagious virus and also suspend certain provisions of the Illinois Open Meetings Act to allow for public bodies to continue their course of business during the public health emergency. Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on December 31, 2020 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were County Board Chairman John Shure, Roger Bard, Barbara Offill, and Joe Young. Lyle Behrends, Charlie Alt, and Michael McTaggart were absent. Also present Finance Manager Jill Johnson, County Clerk Brein Suver, EMA Director Eric Ceci, Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler and Treasurer Kurt Albers.

The meeting was called to order.

It was moved by Roger Bard and seconded by Barbara Offill to approve the agenda. Motion carried by a voice vote.

There were no public comments.

The Committee Chairs gave their monthly reports:

- Tax/Planning & Zoning chairman Roger Bard reported the committee will hear their standard reports.
- Health chairman Barbara Offill reported the Health committee will hear their standard reports and receive an update on COVID-19.
- I.T. chairman Joe Young reported the email server was replaced and seems to be working well.

County Board Chairman John Shure made the committee aware of the change in the mileage rate reimbursement from 57.5 cents per mile to .56 cents per mile per the IRS as of January 1, 2021. New County Board timesheets will be distributed.

EMA Director Eric Ceci reported Iroquois County has started receiving the COVID-19 vaccine and EMA has been assisting with the mass vaccination plans as well as the logistics of getting the vaccine out to the first tiers according to the IDPH mass vaccination plan. Ceci also discussed the new requirements that were due January 15th to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency. Ceci said this deadline has been pushed back to March 15th.

The application for a liquor license for John and Kendra Martin was discussed. Suver explained John and Kendra Martin, DBA The Topper, LLC, is in the process of purchasing The Topper. There will be some extensive remodeling and it is unsure when they will reopen. All new applicants require a background search before a license is issued. Sheriff Derek Hagen responded to Suver's background search request that there was no reason to deny the liquor license. The license is for half a year and payment has already been received. The license applied for is a 2 A.M. closing time license. Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler added he was contacted about adding onto the building for a gaming room. The building is in a flood plain, which is a concern. There is a stipulation in the ordinance that states if you are not building more than 20% of the original building size, you can add on at the same elevation. It was moved by Offill and seconded by Young to approve the application for a liquor license for John and Kendra Martin. Motion carried by a voice vote.

A claim for dues from United Counties Council of Illinois was received for FY21 and they have also refunded the Counties dues for FY20. It was moved by Young and seconded by Offill to approve the United Counties Council of Illinois claim for dues in the amount of \$1,500 for fiscal year 2021. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Shure gave an update on the sexual harassment training. Although the training is mandatory for all employees, Shure said not all employees completed the training in 2020. Finance Manager Jill Johnson said there are 23 employees that still need to take the training, of which 11 are new hires and 1 employee is on medical leave. Johnson said a majority of the new hires are within the health department and she is working with them to get their certificates. Going forward, Johnson will send the training information to all department heads and will also set up and in-person training session in the spring. The training has already been implemented with the new hire process.

It was moved by Offill and seconded by Bard to enter into executive session at 9:26 A.M. under statute 5 ILCS 120/2/c1: The appointment, employment, compensation, discipline,

performance, or dismissal of specific employees of the public body. Motion carried by a voice vote.

It was moved by Young and seconded by Bard to come out of executive session at 10:08 A.M. Motion carried by a voice vote.

Appointments include the reappointment of Barbara Offill, Lisa Breymeyer, and Dr. Philip Zumwalt to the Board of Health.

Correspondence was reviewed and distributed. An invoice from the City of Watseka was received for the recycling event in the amount of \$4,928.25. The invoice will be forwarded to the Finance Committee.

The City of Watseka also returned their signed communication agreement.

There was no old business.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Offill and seconded by Young to adjourn at 10:15 A.M. Motion carried by a voice vote.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on January 4, 2021 at 9:00 A.M. Members present Lyle Behrends, Paul Bowers, Paul Ducat, and John Zumwalt. Charlie Alt, Kevin Bohlmann and Sherry Johnson were absent. Also present County Board Chairman John Shure, Maintenance Supervisor Chris Drake, 911 Director Eric Raymond, and County Board member Roger Bard.

The meeting was called to order.

There were no public comments.

There were no updates on the County Farm.

Maintenance Supervisor Chris Drake's report included the following:

- Centrica Business Solutions (formerly SmartWatt) emailed a year one measurement and verification report. Their guaranteed savings of the energy performance project was \$33,834 and their verified savings over the past year was \$39,755. This is a savings surplus of almost \$6,000 for the County. The full report is available for review in the County Board office.
- Snow removal has been minor, thus far.
- Freezer in the Jail kitchen was recharged.
- Illiana Lock Service is rekeying the locks at the old Headstart location. They are also working on a project at the Circuit Clerk's Office which includes keyless entry and dutch doors for two doors.
- Alterations continue at the Health Department. A storage room is being remodeled for office space and requires heating and cooling. The repairs will be paid with grant money.
- The two capital improvement projects, which include the north parking lot at the Courthouse/Jail and the door retro fit at the Jail, will go out for bid.
- Lastly, Drake discussed the mowing contract and the need for it to go out for bid. It was moved by John Zumwalt and seconded by Ducat to put the mowing contract out for bid for a three year contract. Motion carried by a voice vote.

County Board Chairman John Shure commented on the modifications being done at the health department and to other areas of the building. Shure said one of the terms in the contracts with our renters is that any modifications to the building must be approved by the County Board. Although the health department doesn't have a lease, they are still similar to the other tenants in the building. It was moved by Ducat and seconded by Bowers to approve the modifications being made to the Administrative Center by the health department. Motion carried by a voice vote.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Bowers and seconded by Zumwalt to pay the claims, subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on January 5, 2021 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Barbara Offill, Roger Bard, Kevin Coughenour, Ernie Curtis, Leanne Duby, and John Zumwalt. Thomas Lynch was absent. Also present County Board Chairman John Shure, Finance Manager Jill Johnson, EMA Director Eric Ceci, and Animal Control Director Dr. Youssef.

The meeting was called to order.

It was moved by Roger Bard and seconded by John Zumwalt to approve the agenda. Motion carried by a voice vote.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Leanne Duby and seconded by Kevin Coughenour to pay the claims, subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

There were no public comments.

Animal Control Director Dr. Youssef gave his report for December which included 3 bats that tested negative for rabies, 4 dogs and 2 cats brought to the clinic.

EMA Director Eric Ceci distributed the monthly summary report of programs. During the month of December, there were 50 childhood immunizations administered. There have been 3 animal bites and 7 rabies cases. All rabies cases were negative. Ceci reported 631 COVID-19

cases in December. Of the 631 cases, 530 were confirmed cases and 101 were probable. There were zero new outbreaks in December but there are 5 current outbreaks that started in November and are likely continuing. Ceci also mentioned the 152 permits issued for food sanitation is due to the annual food permit applications that come in in December.

Roger Bard asked about the protocol for restaurants offering dine-in service and their wait staff not wearing masks. Ceci responded according to the Governor's executive orders, all employees at any restaurants should be wearing masks. Complaints can be issued to the health department and they will inform the restaurant about not complying with the Governor's executive orders.

Ceci reviewed data sheets displaying the numbers of COVID-19 confirmed cases and probable cases in Iroquois County. Ceci pointed out the highest day of confirmed cases was mid November. The numbers have been trending downward. The number of individuals isolated or hospitalized has also gone down since November. Ceci reported 52 deaths associated with COVID-19 in Iroquois County. County Board Chairman John Shure spoke with Ceci about the decrease in Iroquois County's cases and how they compare with other counties. Also, with our cases decreasing Shure asked if Ceci anticipates a reopening plan soon. Ceci said he unfortunately is unsure of how the decrease in cases will affect the County at this time but Illinois is moving in the right direction with daily cases.

Two shipments of the COVID-19 vaccine were received. The first shipment was Pfizer and contained 237 doses and they were issued within the first few days of receiving the vaccine. The second shipment was 600 doses of the Moderna vaccine. In total, 537 COVID-19 first round vaccines have been issued. Ceci said the health department is following Illinois mass vaccination plan when administering the vaccine. A new version of the vaccination plan was released yesterday with minor changes. Ceci said they begin with Phase 1A as follows:

- Hospital setting and frontline medical workers
- Dentists, Eye Doctors, Medical Clinics
- First Responders (EMS, EMT's, Fire Departments, Law Enforcement)
- Staff and Faculty at schools

Iroquois County is currently in Phase 1B and is ahead of many areas in the state due to less people taking the vaccine than anticipated.

Iroquois Memorial Hospital has been administering the vaccine. The 2nd doses of Pfizer will be done on Thursday. Ceci noted the vaccine is voluntary and free of charge. Side effects can include arm soreness, headache, fever and possible allergic reaction. Long-term side effects are unknown at this time. Ceci also added he is unsure of when the vaccination will be available to the general public due to a supply issue.

There was no old business.

There was no new business.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Zumwalt and seconded by DUBY to adjourn at 9:28 A.M.

The department heads gave their monthly reports:

- County Clerk Breein Suver reported her storage room was moved yesterday with the help of Tax/Zoning chairman Roger Bard, County Board Chairman John Shure, John Zumwalt and several employees of the health department.
All levies for taxing bodies have been filed and are being entered into the Devnet program. In the meantime, the County Clerk's Office will wait for the Assessment Office to roll to them, which usually occurs in March or April. Tax bill preparation is progressing and a tentative multiplier of one was received last week. Suver said they will wait for the final multiplier after the Assessment Office completes their portion and abstracts are sent into the State. Ballot certifications have been coming into the office for the consolidated election. They are due at the end of this month. Suver stated full reimbursement has been received for what was submitted for the CARES Grant and she is waiting for reimbursement for the postage grant. Lastly, Suver informed the committee that discussions will need to begin at the Policy & Procedure Committee meeting about redistricting. She is currently waiting on census numbers from the 2020 census in order to be able to start the process. The County Board has to pass an ordinance by July 1st which includes redistricting, board salaries, County Board Chairman and Vice Chairman salaries.
- County Treasurer Kurt Albers reported a press release regarding senior exemption forms for property taxes went out today. This allows seniors to apply to have their property taxes deferred. Also, any changes to mobile homes need to be directed to the Treasurer's Office.
- Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler presented his monthly report to the committee and also included a building permit report for 2020. Yergler said he would like the committee to begin discussions on establishing penalties for individuals that do not get permits before building. Also, Yergler informed the committee of an upcoming retirement in his office. Yergler said he has plans to fill the vacant position.

County Clerk Breein Suver presented the committee with resolutions from the trustee for four properties that have been sold. Of the four properties, one was sold to the Village of Milford and two were sold to the Village of Donovan. The total amount coming to the County is \$1,398. Suver noted all properties were sold at the minimum bid. It was moved by Zumwalt and seconded by Leanne Duby to approve the four resolutions for the sale of property acquired through the delinquent tax process. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Your Committee met at the Courthouse on January 6, 2021 at 3:00 P.M. Members present were Lyle Behrends, Paul Ducat, Roger Bard, Steve Huse, Chad McGinnis and David Penny. Donna Crow was absent. Also present County Board Chairman John Shure, Probation Supervisor Barb King, Judge Mike Sabol, Judge Kara Bartucci, Circuit Clerk Lisa Hines and 911 Director Eric Raymond.

The meeting was called to order.

It was moved by David Penny and seconded by Roger Bard to approve the agenda. Motion carried by a voice vote.

There were no public comments.

Probation Supervisor Barb King reported a discussion was held a few months ago on applying for the drug free communities grant through the juvenile justice council. The grant has been received. King said it is a 5 year grant and can be renewable for another 5 years. The amount of the grant is \$125,000 per year or \$625,000 over the span of 5 years. King reviewed the Probation & Court Services activity report for December with the committee.

Judge Mike Sabol reported a new copier/printer was purchased and new laptops were purchased for himself and Judge Kara Bartucci. The laptops will allow both judges to work remotely from the bench. Due to serious health issues, Public Defender Joe Anthony will not be returning to work. Sabol said they are in the process of finding a replacement for Mr. Anthony. In the meantime, there is one person in custody for murder that Mr. Anthony was representing and needs an attorney immediately due to a speedy trial demand. Attorney Lance Cagle from Paxton will be representing the case at \$100 per hour.

Circuit Clerk Lisa Hines distributed her monthly report for December to the committee for their review. A total of \$43,812.03 was received in fines and fees, \$4,226.36 was received from Credit Collection Partners and \$233.47 was received from IDROP. In 2020, a total of \$72,266.70 was received from Credit Collection Partners and \$61,857.06 was received from IDROP.

911 Director Eric Raymond distributed his monthly ETSB report to the committee. The 911 center had a recent resignation. Raymond reported ETSB is still entertaining bids for the public safety software.

There was no old business.

During new business, Chad McGinnis discussed 911 Director Eric Raymond's residency. Raymond explained the ETSB Board made modifications to his job description allowing a 15 mile limitation outside of the Iroquois County border but within the state of Illinois. McGinnis stated if a change was made to the job description, the County Board should have voted on the change. Raymond, however, said the County Board has no control on his position. While the County Board may have voted on his job description at one time, he is an ETSB employee. McGinnis continued by informing Raymond that as an ETSB employee, he is a temporary employee and the County ordinance says ETSB can only hire temporary employees. McGinnis said he doesn't believe it looks good for a director of an Iroquois County agency to move outside of the County. Allowing Raymond to move outside of the County shows neglect on the ETSB Board because they are not following our Ordinance and the County Board may have to review the job description voted on in 2018. If there is a contract, an end date needs to be included or the County Board needs to amend the ordinance and give the ETSB Board the power to hire permanent employees. McGinnis warned this is an issue the Edgar County Watchdogs have raised in the past and he is trying to avoid it happening again. The matter will be discussed further at Policy & Procedure and County Board Chairman John Shure will also involve State's Attorney Jim Devine.

Also during new business, Shure spoke to the committee about the \$1.50 telephone surcharge which is scheduled to sunset at the end of the year. Shure said he has been in contact with State Representative Tom Bennett about increasing the amount to \$3. Shure urged all board members to contact their State Representative and State Senator about the matter.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Paul Ducat and seconded by Penny to pay the Judicial & Public Safety claims, subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Steve Huse and seconded by Ducat to adjourn the meeting at 3:23 P.M. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

- Sheriff Derek Hagen reported bids will be going out for resurfacing the north parking lot at the Courthouse and retro-fitting the doors in the Jail. Hagen said he has two Correctional Officers that will be going to the academy in February.
- Treasurer Kurt Albers reported a press release went out regarding mobile bills. All changes need to be directed to the Treasurer's Office.
- Finance Manager Jill Johnson reported she continues to work on the FY20 audit. Auditors were onsite in December to complete their preliminary work.
- 911 Director Eric Raymond reported there is a vacancy in Joint Dispatch. The ETSB Board met with Sheriff Derek Hagen in regards to the public safety software.

County Board Chairman John Shure discussed the \$1.50 telephone surcharge that is scheduled to sunset this year. Shure said he has had conversations with State Representative Tom Bennett about increasing the fee to \$3. Shure also informed Mr. Bennett of the unfortunate events that seem to be occurring throughout the state. Fraudulent claims are being filed and many individuals are receiving unemployment benefits. This has happened within the County and to some of the County employees. Mr. Bennett said he was already aware of the situation. Lastly, the law enforcement contract Shure and Hagen have been working on with Gilman and Onarga is stalemated due to the holidays. Shure has reached out to the Mayor of Gilman about scheduling another meeting.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Steve Huse to pay the claims subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

During new business, Albers suggested the BB&T account that was created for the SmartWatt project be closed and consolidated with other funds. Raymond stated there is \$150,000 in contingency but he will have to open his budget. The contingency line was budgeted for a radio system that is outdated and a planned generator project. Raymond said the ETSB Board tabled the matter based upon discussion from the Finance committee. McTaggart questioned how long the ETSB Board had been entertaining the idea of the new software and also suggested the committee review the public safety tax fund. Raymond said some of the project had been delayed for COVID-19 related reasons but the bidding process started in October or November. Hagen received information about his cost in December. It was moved by McTaggart and seconded by Johnson to table discussion on the CAD software upgrade until February. Motion carried by a voice vote.

The health department continues to purchase additional workstations and they are being set-up during the scheduled on-site technician hours. The Highway Department has Windows 7 workstations to be replaced. The 911 server and the Abila server is scheduled for replacement.

Taber discussed passwords and the possibility of changing the policy to require them to be longer. Taber also mentioned enabling two-factor VPN for remote access.
