The Iroquois County board met in Recessed Session on Tuesday, March 9, 2021 at 9 A.M. The meeting was conducted in person and via Zoom, under Phase 4 of the Governor's Plan to reopen the State of Illinois and Executive Order 2021-04. The phased opening and executive order were issued in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, they require social distancing measures to be taken to stop the spread of the highly contagious virus and also suspend certain provisions of the Illinois Open Meetings Act to allow for public bodies to continue their course of business during the public health emergency. Chairman Shure called the meeting to order and asked County Clerk Breein Suver to call the roll.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

He encouraged the Board to be diligent in their representation of all of their constituents.

CHAIRMAN COMMENTS

Chairman Shure read from an email he received from IEDA Director Ken Barragree announcing his upcoming retirement and the need for the IEDA Board to begin their search for a new director. Ken explained that they were spreading the news by posting on the IEDA website and also providing the job description to all local municipalities in hopes of finding a qualified candidate. Ken will be conducting the interviews and will remain active with the organization through May.

OUTSIDE ORGANIZATION REPORTS

Mr. McGinnis gave a brief update on the 708 Mental Health Board which met at the end of February. He said they reviewed the budget and talked about the Iroquois Mental Health Center beginning to provide mental health services in conjunction with Iroquois Memorial Hospital.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on January 28, 2020 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were County Board Chairman John Shure, Lyle Behrends, Charlie Alt, Roger Bard and Joe Young. Michael McTaggart and Barbara Offill were absent. Also present Finance Manager Jill Johnson, County Clerk Breein Suver, EMA Director Eric Ceci, Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler, 911 Director Eric Raymond and Myron Munyon with Compass Insurance.

The meeting was called to order.

It was moved by Charlie Alt and seconded by Roger Bard to approve the agenda. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

There were no public comments.

The Committee Chairs gave their monthly reports:

- Management and Judicial chairman Lyle Behrends reported the Judicial committee will hear their standard reports. The Management committee will also hear their standard reports and discussion will be held about replacing drainage tile.
- Tax/Planning & Zoning chairman Roger Bard reported the committee will hear their standard reports and Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler will begin discussion on penalties for not filing for building permits.
- I.T. chairman Joe Young reported the I.T. committee will hear their standard reports from AreaWide.
- Highway chairman Charlie Alt reported the Highway committee will take action on a resolution for a bridge in Stockland Township and also take action on an agreement for township bridge inspections.

County Board Chairman John Shure spoke about an article that was published in the Gilman newspaper. The article stated both Onarga and Gilman have dropped their plans to work with the County on receiving law enforcement services from the County.

EMA Director Eric Ceci reported EMA has been assisting the health department with vaccine planning. The second dose vaccination clinic is being held today. Ceci said he is also working on accreditation requirements for EMA to be submitted to the State by March 15th. These include the Illinois Capability Assessment and THIRA Tool (ILCAT), Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP), Continuity of Government Plan (COG) and a new version of the County's Emergency Operations Plan. The Continuity of Operations Plan and Continuity of Government Plan are both new requirements by the State of Illinois. Also, March is severe weather preparedness month.

The committee continued discussions regarding County Board redistricting and setting salaries for the County Board to be completed by July 1st. As of now, the County Board does not have census numbers to begin the process. County Clerk Breein Suver said she spoke with a gentleman from the census bureau and was given an April 1st date. Shure noted the County Board salaries can be decided on without the census numbers. The changes being discussed will take place during fiscal year 2023. The allocations in place for fiscal year 2021 are as follows:

If the number of board members were reduced, the overall totals would remain the same but the per diem for meetings could increase and the salaries for the Chairman and Vice Chairman could increase. The County Board can choose to leave everything as it is now. Another option is to keep the board districts the same as they are now but reduce the number from each district to four. This change would reduce County Board members from 20 to 16. Lastly, the number of County Board members can be reduced to 15 and there would be 5 County Board districts with 3 County Board members from each district. Shure said no matter what decision is made, there is potential for cost savings. At this time there are several of the committees that have 7 members and Shure believes 5 members would be sufficient. Behrends voiced his concern about having members spread too thin on committees and causing issues with quorums for meetings. Shure said

there could also be an opportunity to merge committees. Further discussion will continue to be held at future meetings. Shure suggested the committee take time to review the budget in regards to the County Board line items.

Finance Manager Jill Johnson gave an update on the sexual harassment training. Three in person training sessions have been scheduled for March 12th. Our online completion rate so far this year is at 19%. Last year the overall completion rate was 91%.

It was moved by Alt and seconded by Bard to enter into executive session at 9:39 A.M. under statute 5 ILCS 120/2/c1: The appointment, employment, compensation, discipline, performance, or dismissal of specific employees of the public body. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

It was moved by Bard and seconded by Alt to come out of executive session at 10:43 A.M. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Correspondence was reviewed with the committee.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Bard and seconded by Behrends to approve the claims subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried

During old business, Myron Munyon with Compass Insurance addressed the committee about revisions to personnel policies. Shure said the committee can begin reviewing the policies next month and forward revisions to Munyon. Also, Munyon informed the committee of new training programs that are available through Bliss McKnight at no cost to the County. These trainings can be done remotely or with a moderator. Munyon will forward a list of the trainings to Johnson.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on March 1, 2021 at 9:06 A.M. Members present Lyle Behrends, Charlie Alt, Paul Bowers and John Zumwalt. Kevin Bohlmann, Paul Ducat and Sherry Johnson were absent. Also present County Board Chairman John Shure, Finance Manager Jill Johnson, Maintenance Supervisor Chris Drake, 911 Director Eric Raymond and Mark Ekhoﬀ with Clean Energy Design Group.

The meeting was called to order.

It was moved by Paul Bowers and seconded by Charlie Alt to approve the agenda. Motion carried by a voice vote.

There were no public comments.

Maintenance Supervisor Chris Drake's report included the following:

- Most of February consisted of snow removal
- B&D Electric assisted with issues in the Jail kitchen
- Drake is working on a welding project at the Jail
- A walk-behind salt spreader was purchased
- Heat pump outside of the Finance Office was serviced
- Snow removal for the season consisted of 3 ½ pallets of salt being used and 2 tanks of fuel. The part-time employee worked 45.5 hours from October to current earning \$1,001. In total, the County paid \$2,700 for snow removal.

The committee discussed the drainage tile on the County Farm. John Zumwalt said he has reviewed the lease and it states the tenant is required to provide all necessary labor to repair the existing tile. The current tenant needs to be contacted and inform them of their responsibility. Zumwalt met with a vendor about putting a tile line in through Route 1 west to the ditch and was given a rough estimate of \$50,000. Zumwalt said we will also need to speak with the landowner's to the west of the County Farm about their level of financial commitment because it crosses into their land. Management chairman Lyle Behrends recommended doing a search for a tile agreement in the County Clerk's Office. County Board Chairman John Shure also noted he spoke with the landowner and they are expecting a call from Zumwalt.

Behrends informed the committee that an issue has arisen with the way property taxes are paid on the County Farm. The issue originated in another county and a FOIA was received in the County Clerk's Office. The statute will need to be looked into and the committee will need to inform State's Attorney Jim Devine.

Mark Ekhoﬀ with Clean Energy Design Group distributed an updated solar farm proposal for the Administrative Center and the Courthouse. Both proposals are 20 year contracts at no expense to the County. The expected savings to the County over 20 years for the Administrative Center is \$230,721 and the Courthouse is \$113,284. A letter of intent will need to be signed by the County in order to proceed. The committee will also verify with State's Attorney Jim Devine

about making the project available for public bidding even though no money is involved. It was moved by Zumwalt and seconded by Bowers to proceed with the letter of intent from Clean Energy Design Group, pending State's Attorney Jim Devine's approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Bowers and seconded by Zumwalt to pay the claims, subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

COUNTY FARM PROPERTY TAX STATUS

The Board began discussion regarding the County Farm property tax status. Supervisor of Assessment Bob Yergler said the farm was tax exempt until 2012 when a former County Board Chairman felt the property should be taxed since it was being farmed for personal gain of the tenant at the time, Walker Farms. Bob said he reviewed the farm lease and it states the lessor is responsible for the property taxes which, in turn, made the County responsible for the payment of the taxes once it was taken from exempt status. The taxes on the farm are approximately \$10,000 per year. Bob explained that other tax-exempt entities, like Illinois Department of Natural Resources, have leases that make the lessee responsible for the payment of taxes. It was noted that Shelby County has the same issue regarding the taxation of their farmland and their State's Attorney has asked for an Attorney General's opinion regarding the matter. Iroquois County State's Attorney Jim Devine said he felt the farm should be tax exempt; however, he said he would be obtaining a copy of the opinion from the Attorney General once it is finalized. Chairman John Shure confirmed that he would be addressing the issue with Illinois State Representative Tom Bennett, regarding possible legislation that would clarify the issue. As discussion came to an end, it was moved by Mr. Ducat and seconded to change the status of the County owned farmland to tax exempt. The motion carried by a roll call vote.

ICPHD Administrator Dee Schippert distributed the monthly summary report of programs.

Schippert gave an update on COVID-19 stating the number of cases continue to trend downwards. To date, there have been 11 first dose clinics and 4 second dose clinics with a total of 5,376 people being vaccinated. Forty-one percent of people 65 or older have been vaccinated with one dose. Schippert said ICPHD has been assured by the state that second doses will be fulfilled.

Schippert explained an individual is considered immune two weeks past their second dose. If a vaccinated person comes into contact with someone that has COVID-19, the vaccinated person does not have to quarantine.

EMA Director Eric Ceci reviewed data sheets displaying the numbers COVID-19 confirmed cases and probable cases in Iroquois County.

The department heads gave their monthly reports:

- County Clerk Breein Suver reported early voting for the consolidated election began on February 25th. Suver provided statistics comparing early voters in the general election to early voters in the consolidated election. As of today, there have been 11 early voters for the consolidated election and as of the Tuesday after early voting began for the general election last year, there were 180 early voters. There were 2,073 vote by mail ballots that went out on the first day of vote by mail during the general election and 5 ballots were mailed on the first day of vote by mail for this consolidated election. Election judge school will be held in the County Board Room on March 16th, 17th and 18th. Statements of Economic Interest are being mailed out Wednesday, March 3rd.
- County Treasurer Kurt Albers reported mobile home bills are being mailed out today. Last year the County waived penalties for 60 days on the first installment of property taxes due to COVID-19. Albers said some counties are reverting back to charging penalties. It was moved by Leanne Duby and seconded by Zumwalt to not waive penalties for property taxes. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.
- Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler reported the Board of Review tentative notices will be going out this week.

County Clerk Breein Suver distributed a monthly resolution list from the trustee showing the parcels that have been sold to Auction Flippers, LLC. The properties are located in Beaverville, Donovan, Sheldon and Woodworth. SOLAR ORDINANCE

The Board discussed the County Solar Ordinance. Chairman Shure said the need for discussion surrounding the ordinance was in part to a proposed solar farm that will encompass approximately 400 acres. Mr. McGinnis began discussion by presenting a mitigation agreement that is required by the Illinois Department of Agriculture. He said there are some areas in the document that contradict the County Ordinance and vice versa that the Board should look at and be aware. The statute that governs solar farms was passed when the County was working on their ordinance and he said there are differences that could be addressed. The decommissioning or deconstruction is set up differently between both entities. This has put us over the \$750,000 threshold for federal expenditures and a single audit will have to be performed. CliftonLarsonAllen is preparing an audit engagement letter. Sexual harassment training is being held in the County Board room on March 12th. Johnson completed an online training for cash flow forecasting on February 25th and is registered for an advanced governmental accounting online course on April 29th through May 13th.
- 911 Director Eric Raymond reported he has a vacancy in his department.

County Board Chairman John Shure made the Finance committee aware of questions regarding the County Farm and the legality of property taxes and how they are paid. The issues have originated out of Shelby County. There are also questions and concerns about how we are structured. Shure said the matter will mostly be handled through the Management committee.

Brian Loman with Loman-Ray Insurance Group spoke to the committee about the services Loman-Ray Insurance Group can provide to the County. They currently provide services to 30 county municipalities in central Illinois and have 10 office locations. Loman said they do their best to keep renewals under 5% each year.
